Curriculum Coverage Overview – Autumn Term 2 2023/2024

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

This term, we will explore feelings and look at ways we can manage emotions like sadness and anger. We will look at what happens when we have a fallout and how we can resolve this fallout peacefully. Children will be encouraged to work together in groups and teams to develop turn-taking and sharing, and playing alongside each other as well as develop the confidence to initiate play themselves.

Expressive Arts and Design:

During art sessions, the Children will use a range of junk materials and mark-making equipment to paint pictures and create story settings such as a forest or a farm to go with a traditional tale. Children can bring in Various items to use for junk modelling. These can include cereal boxes, Cartons, bottles and other items that can be recycled.


Physical Development:

We will be utilising the outdoor area to develop children's negotiation of space and develop gross motor skills. They will take part in activities and games such as racing by adjusting speed, jumping off different heights, climbing objects and stairs, and moving around whilst avoiding obstacles.

Understanding the World:

We will learn about traditional tales and explore different materials found in stories. We will compare and contrast the different Characters in stories and explore figures from the past. The Children will look at why things happen and how things work, for example, making bread. Children will also use talk to connect ideas, and explain what is happening and what might happen next.



TRADITIONAL TALES

Communication, Language and Literacy:

Our topic this term is Traditional Tales.

Children will have many opportunities to listen to, join in and read along with popular and well-loved stories. We will write our own story maps, describe characters and have a go at writing an alternative ending to a story. Children will also listen to different stories to help develop their listening and attention skills as well as expanding their vocabulary.

Islamic Studies

This term in Islamic studies, we will be covering the following topics:

- The five pillars of Islam.
- Islamic months Songs
- How to use the toilet.
- · Good and bad Akhlaaq.
- Manners of eating.

Qaidah

To recognise the Arabic letters from Alif to yaa in standalone form (sequence). To recognise the Arabic letters Aif to yaa in standalone form (random).

Surah and Dua Memorisation

- Surah Naas
- Dua when we something great and nice.
- Dua when we climb up and down the stairs.
- Tashhaud.

Mathematics:

Children will represent, compare and compose numbers 1 to 5 making sure they are formed correctly. They will learn to count from any given number form 1-10. They will also learn about one more and one less. Children will explore shapes with 1, 3 and 4 sides.
