

Curriculum Coverage Overview – Spring Term 2 2023-2024

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

This term, the children will be supported to recognise their personal achievements and set up their own goals. They will have opportunities to reflect, talk and evaluate their work with their peers. They will look at ways they can avoid certain actions and behaviours that can lead to conflict but also how they can resolve conflicts in a peaceful and friendly way.

Communication, Language and Literacy:

As part of our topic on 'Transport', children will learn new vocabulary and have opportunities to ask and respond to 'why' questions. They will continue to write simple sentences adding more detail and making sure they practise pre-cursive letter formation and include finger spaces. They will also use this vocabulary to write labels, captions and lists. Using our topic on transport, children will listen to and join in with a range of stories linked to our theme. We will look at rhymes and repetition in books and encourage children to continue a rhyming string.

Physical Development:

The children will learn to travel in different directions to support coordination including around, under, over and through a variety of equipment and learn to balance with confidence. Children will be encouraged to continue developing independence with health and self-care particularly dressing and undressing. The children will continue using a range of mark making tools to develop fine motor skills and pencil control.

Reception Class

Mathematics:

The children will represent, sort, compare and order numbers up to ten. They will explore different ways to make ten including learning about number bonds to 10. They will explore doubles and odd and even numbers. Children will gain confidence in learning about one more and one less. They will also explore 3D shapes and will recap patterns and sequences.



Expressive Arts and Design:

Using different media materials, children will create constructions of different vehicles, road signs and road layouts. The children will have the opportunity to perform in the Ramadhan assembly where they will take part in role play and sing a nasheed.

Islamic Studies:

This term in Islamic studies, the children will learn the importance of salah, why we have to pray as Muslims. They will begin to learn the steps of salah. We will also look at the story of Musa (as). As we will look at the topic of Transport this term, children will learn about the story of the migration to Medina and what type of transport they used in the Prophet's time.

Qaaidah:

- To recognise the different formation of the Arabic letters.
- To read 3 or 4 letter words with a fathah, dhammah or kasrah.

Surah and Dua Memorisation:

- Surah Falaq
- Dua after Wudhu
- Dua when traveling
- Dua when sleeping
- 1-10 Numbers in Arabic

Understanding of the World:

Children will investigate different types of transport and their role in the community and environment. Children will be encouraged to carry out observations on transport in their local area and talk about similarities and differences between modern types of transport and those used in the past. They will take part in activities where they will explore various materials and use them to come up with their own models of transport. We will look at travelling around the world and what the best mode of travel is to reach a destination.
