

English: 'All About Me', 'Where's My Teddy?' and 'Traction Man'

The children will begin the year by creating an 'All About Me' lapbook to celebrate their individuality and promote creativity. This term the children will focus on two books, Where's My Teddy? by Jez Alborough and Traction Man by Mini Grey. They will be focusing on developing sentences, understanding setting, characters and plot development as well as writing simple non-fiction and fictional texts of their own.

Art: Colour Chaos

This term, the children will focus on colour chaos; exploring warm and cool colours. They will choose, use and mix their own paint colours to create artwork in a range of abstract styles inspired by six key abstract artists: Mondrian, Rothko, Klee, Pollock, Delaunay & Kandinsky.

History: Toys Past and Present

This term, Year 1 will study what toys are like now and what toys were like in the past. Children will also learn the similarities and differences between old and new toys as well as explore the ways in which we can tell 'old' from 'new'. They will also learn how the old toys were played with.

IPSHE: Friends

This term, the children will learn the importance of friendship, understanding the characteristics of a good friend and a bad friend and how to be a good/bad friend. The children will learn how to make themselves and others feel positive, how to manage conflict and recognising bullying, what to do, and being a bystander of bullying.

Computing: Internet Safety

This term, the children will be focusing on taking ownership of their creative work, searching the internet safely, being S.M.A.R.T online, protecting their personal information and sending emails.

Year 1

Science: Flowering Plants & Seasons

This term, the children will be learning to understand how the world around us changes during different seasons and the features of each season. They will also be learning about how to classify plants into two different categories, '*flowering plants or non-flowering plants*' and '*wild plants or garden plants*'. The children will further learn to name and describe the different parts of plants.



Arabic

In Arabic this term, the children will learn about:

- Greetings; saying 'My name is...'
- Names of colours
- Demonstrative pronouns: This – هَذَا
- People: boy, girl, family members, etc.

PE: The Seasons **PE Day: Wednesday**

The children will learn how to work individually, in pairs and in groups and will develop their understanding of movement terminologies such as mirroring, improvisation, canon and unison.

Maths: Place Value, Addition & Subtraction (Within 10)

This term, the children will learn how to sort, count, represent and compare objects. They will learn how to count forwards and backwards, count one more, one less and one to one correspondence within 10. The children will be introduced to greater than, less than and equal to and will learn how to compare numbers, order objects and numbers within 10, and become familiar with ordinal numbers and the number line. The children will also learn the concept of the part-whole model, number bonds and fact families as well as begin to write number sentences. They will become familiar with the addition and subtraction symbols and application to sums; adding and subtracting one or two from a number.

Islamic Studies: Fiqh

In Islamic Studies, the children will be learning the basic beliefs of a Muslim.

They will be covering the following topics:

- Basic introduction to five pillars of Islam (Shahadah, Salaah, Zakah, Saum & Hajj)
- Introduction to Taharah
- Keeping clean
- How to use the toilet
- Why we do wudhu
- Method of wudhu
- Things that break wudhu
- Names of the 5 daily prayers
- Basic Salaah positions.
